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The objective of this book is to layout the core Christian doctrines of the *Louisiana Christian-Israel Fellowship & Christian America Ministries* in order to be used as a study aid and to promote Christian unity within the Body of Christ and ready ourselves with the proper defenses when we are asked the reason of the hope that is within us, and why we believe what we believe¹. My hope is that this small book can be used as an example to other Christian fellowships to create similar tools for their own congregations, to better prepare our children and the next generations by “*perfecting of the saints, for the work of the ministry, for the edifying (building up) of the body of Christ*” (Ephesians 4:11).

Concerning God, We Believe —

in the existence of one living and true God², whose subsistence is in and of Himself, infinite in being and perfection; whose essence cannot be comprehended by any but Himself. This one and true God is commonly identified in the Bible as the God of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob³, and in most English translations of the Scriptures as “The LORD” rendered from the Hebrew YHWH⁴. We believe in the beginning God created the heavens and the earth, the sea, and all living things and said it was all very good⁵. He alone is Spirit⁶, Infinite⁷, Perfect⁸, the Source, Support, Beginning and End of all things⁹. He alone is Sovereign¹⁰, Omnipotent¹¹, Omniscient¹², Omnipresent¹³. We are Monotheist¹⁴ in this belief, believing that there is only ONE true and living God in all the universe¹⁵. In this divine

and infinite Being there are three, the Father, the Son, and Holy Spirit¹⁶, of one substance, power, and eternity. All three being eternal without beginning, and all three being the one true and living God. Through Christian history the descriptive word “trinity” or “triune”¹⁷ has been used to describe the Godhead.¹⁸

Concerning The Scriptures, We Believe —

that all “*Scripture is given by inspiration of God, and is profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness*”¹⁹, by which we accept and believe that the 66 books of the Protestant Holy Bible to be the written revelation of God, complete and sufficient in all respects. We believe in the promise that His Word will never pass away and will always be on the Earth²⁰. We believe the Scriptures to be fully authoritative in and of themselves; Scripture does not rely for its authority upon any church, council, or creed, but is authoritative simply because it is the Word of God. The revelation of God’s Word “*came not in old time by the will of man; but holy men of God spake as they were moved by the Holy Ghost*”²¹. We do not believe in one English translation as the Word of God, rather understand that no translation from the Greek and Hebrew into English is perfect²², and we must consult the many manuscripts God has caused through His divine Will to survive through the centuries in order for us to “*Study to shew thyself approved unto God*”²³.

Concerning Jesus, We Believe —

in the supernatural act of the incarnation in which God (YHWH) became flesh in the person known as Jesus the Christ²⁴. We believe Jesus is the Messiah of Israel²⁵, born of a virgin through the power of the Holy Spirit²⁶, of the bloodline of David²⁷, sent to Redeem Israel²⁸. Therefore, we believe Jesus the Christ is God (YHWH) in the flesh²⁹ and is the creator of all things³⁰ and that in order to be a Christian one must adhere to this truth³¹. John the Baptist believed Jesus is YHWH³², the writer of the book of Hebrews believed Jesus is YHWH³³, the Apostle John believed Jesus is YHWH³⁴, the Apostle Paul believed Jesus is YHWH³⁵, the Apostle Peter believed Jesus is YHWH³⁶, the Apostle James believed Jesus is YHWH³⁷, the Apostle Jude believed Jesus is YHWH³⁸, as do we believe Jesus is YHWH in the flesh³⁹.

Concerning Atonement, We Believe —

in the substitutionary⁴⁰ death of Jesus the Christ as being the supreme, the only, once and for all⁴¹, complete atoning sacrifice for our sins⁴².

Through and by the atoning death of Jesus Christ upon the cross He ratified the New Covenant⁴³ and became the mediator⁴⁴ of that Covenant with the House of Israel and the House of Judah⁴⁵ which is now in existence in the New Testament age of grace⁴⁶, whereby fulfilling the prophecy given in Jeremiah 31:31-34.

Concerning Salvation, We Believe —

that our justification⁴⁷ and our Salvation is in Christ and in His finished work alone, completely outside of ourselves⁴⁸; that it is the gift of God, not of works of the law⁴⁹. We believe that God predestined⁵⁰ His elect saints to Salvation who were chosen in Christ before the foundation of the world⁵¹.

Concerning Kingship, We Believe —

that Jesus Christ alone is Head and KING over ALL things right now in this age⁵², including the Church⁵³ which is His Body⁵⁴, and in this exalted position He is Everliving to make intercession for Christians⁵⁵. We believe in the autonomy of all local Christian Churches functioning under the Headship of Jesus Christ and the administration of the Holy Spirit, and that He gave those local Churches Evangelist, Pastors, Elders, Deacons, and Teachers⁵⁶ for *“perfecting of the saints, for the work of the ministry, for the edifying (building up) of the body of Christ (The Church)”*⁵⁷.

Concerning Sin, We Believe —

that sin is the transgression of God's Law⁵⁸, that all have sinned⁵⁹, that death (cessation of life) is the penalty for sin⁶⁰ that God has imputed Adam's sin to all men, thus making all mortal and corruptible⁶¹, that Jesus the Christ alone has immortality⁶², and that God will likewise impute the righteousness of Jesus to all Christians⁶³ and through Him Christians will be resurrected from the dead in physical bodies into eternal life after death at the resurrection⁶⁴. We do not believe that one is saved by the works of God's Law, but we do believe that we as Christians should strive to follow God's Law as an act of love towards Jesus⁶⁵ all the days of our life as our standard of living, and the betterment of God's people in the earth.

Concerning The Holy Spirit, We Believe —

that the Holy Spirit, which is God⁶⁶, was given to Christians as a gift⁶⁷ in Christ's absence on the Earth in physical form, to testify of Christ, to lead our brethren into the truth, and to convict the world of sin, righteousness, and judgment⁶⁸. We believe that the fruits of this Holy Spirit in a Christians life are love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control⁶⁹.

Concerning The Abrahamic Covenant, We Believe —

that God chose the descendants of Abraham⁷⁰, through Isaac and Jacob alone⁷¹, to be a special people unto Himself⁷², and that this Abrahamic Covenant was unconditional. Later on God and Israel bound themselves by Law in a marriage covenant⁷³ at Mt. Sinai⁷⁴; and that this covenant was conditional upon Israel's fulfillment of her vow to follow God's Laws, statutes, and judgments⁷⁵.

Concerning The Old (Mosaic) Covenant, We Believe —

that the Mosaic Covenant was given to Israel⁷⁶; that it was given for Israel's good⁷⁷, but that Israel was to be punished, if it was disregarded⁷⁸; and that the Law of God eventually was to be administered to the entire world⁷⁹. We believe that the Mosaic Covenant was fulfilled (made complete) in Jesus the Christ and that the rituals and sacrifices are no longer needed in the New Covenant age because of this fulfillment. We believe that God's Laws, Statutes, and Judgements for us to live by were in existence before Mt. Sinai⁸⁰ and were added to the Mosaic Covenant⁸¹ with Israel, and that those Laws, Statutes, and Judgements still exists today in the New Covenant age⁸² and we as Christians are to live by these Laws as our standard of living, because to do otherwise is to sin.⁸³

We believe that after the House of Israel and the House of Judah separated as one nation, and that God divorced the House of Israel for her violation of the marriage covenant⁸⁴; that the House of Israel was cast out of the old land⁸⁵, became known in modern times as the "Lost

Tribes of Israel” outside of Scripture, even though they were never lost, but had lost their identity as Israel. The House of Israel went into Assyrian captivity and when they came out, they scattered north-west through Europe going by different names over the centuries. God would again betroth her to Himself according to the prophecies given in Hosea chapter 1 & 2, and then confirmed as being fulfilled in 1st Peter 2:9-11.

Concerning The New Covenant, We Believe —

that the New Covenant was made with the House of Israel and the House of Judah⁸⁶; that Jesus came to confirm that Covenant⁸⁷ and redeem⁸⁸ Israel⁸⁹; and that Jesus Christ's death and resurrection enabled God Almighty to legally remarry His former wife, the people of Israel⁹⁰, and that we are in that New Covenant in this current age.

Concerning Israel's Identity, We Believe —

that the Anglo-Saxon, Germanic, Celtic, Scandinavian and kindred peoples are the only people that fulfill all the prophetic identification marks in Scripture that identify them as being the literal physical descendants of God's covenant people Israel⁹¹, and heirs according to the promises given to Abraham's descendants⁹². Three of these promises are that Israel was to become a multitude of nations⁹³, have a population of people comparable only with the sand of the sea⁹⁴ and star of heaven⁹⁵, and have a multitude of kings⁹⁶, all of which the European people fulfill. This belief is commonly known as Anglo-Israel, or Anglo-Israelism.⁹⁷ Being that every Israelite is born in sin, it is therefore necessary for each Israelite to repent and become a Christian in order to receive the gift of salvation. Salvation is by the grace of God⁹⁸ and is not a result of any works of the Law or genetic lineage.⁹⁹

Concerning Non-Israelites, We Believe —

that non-Israelite people although NOT a part of the New Covenant¹⁰⁰ that was made exclusively with Israel, can and most defiantly should still serve Jesus the Christ, and be obedient to Him, because at the name of Jesus Christ every knee will bow.¹⁰¹

Concerning Kinism¹⁰², We Believe —

in racial distinction and separation, and that the races are God ordained and to be preserved as God made them and that they are to propagate “Kind after Kind”. We believe interracial “mixing” (miscegenation) is a transgression of God’s Law according to the Bible¹⁰³, and that this act destroys both races and is not what God intended. This belief is NOT out of hatred of any race as many falsely believe, rather love for all the races to stay the same as God made them. When one decides to commit miscegenation, they destroy both races involved which God said in Genesis 1:33 were VERY good. This same belief was held by men such as Abraham¹⁰⁴, Isaac and Rebecca¹⁰⁵, Moses¹⁰⁶, Ezra and Nehemiah¹⁰⁷, and many others in Scripture.¹⁰⁸

Concerning Baptism, We Believe —

in the ordinance of adult believer baptism¹⁰⁹ by complete immersion¹¹⁰ in water in the name of Jesus Christ¹¹¹, in which the believer identifies himself with Christ's death, burial, and resurrection¹¹². We believe in 20-year-old believer baptism according to the "age of adulthood" given in Numbers 32:11 & Deuteronomy 1:39, in order that the believer is mature enough and fully understands the importance of what baptism is for and what it represents.¹¹³

The word "pedo" is the Greek word for child. There is not one instance or example of infant baptism in all of Scripture, only believers' baptism.

¹¹⁰ The English word Baptize comes from the Greek word bap-tid-'zo which means to fully submerge in water. We see this in the New Testament, as well as in the Greek Old Testament in passages such as 2nd Kings 5:14. As well as other non-Scriptural Greek writing such as the Apocryphal book of Judith that shows us how this word was used in the 1st century A.D. Concerning Communion, We Believe —

in the ordinance of communion, as established by Jesus Christ¹¹⁴.

Where we as a congregation who are baptized believers partake of unleavened bread and fruit of the vine together as a memorial service to remember the sacrifice made for us by our Lord Jesus the Christ.

We partake of Communion weekly¹¹⁵ every Sunday¹¹⁶, and yearly at Passover.

¹¹⁵ The Scriptures are not 100% clear on the frequency of taking communion, but is clear on the command to do it, we partake of it weekly every Sunday as a tradition (Many in the early Church did the same), not as a command in Scripture.

¹¹⁶ We as a congregation observe Sunday as our weekly Sabbath. We understand that there is much debate within Christianity on what the correct day to observe Sabbath is, and that the Biblical record is not as clear as we would like it to be, or there would not be so many different opinions, and we believe that the truth will be revealed in time. We respect other Christians convictions of observing the Sabbath on the day they understand to be correct and ask them to extend the same grace to us if they disagree. Whether the day they choose is biblically correct or not, many groups of Christians throughout history have been blessed by observing the Sabbath no matter what day they choose to observe it on.

Concerning Christ's Return, We Believe —

in the future bodily return of Jesus Christ to this earth¹¹⁷ in power and great glory who will and does sit right now upon “*the throne of His father David and reign over the house of Jacob forever; and of His kingdom there shall be no end*”¹¹⁸. We do not believe that we as Christian-Israel should be idle in anyway by adhering to this belief, rather we are to “occupy”¹¹⁹, “dominionize”¹²⁰, and advance and seek the Kingdom of God¹²¹ on the Earth until He returns.

The Ten Commandments (Exodus 20)

#1 *Thou shalt have no other gods before me.*

#2 *Thou shalt not make unto thee any graven image,* or any likeness of any thing that is in heaven above, or that is in the earth beneath, or that is in the water under the earth: Thou shalt not bow down thyself to them, nor serve them: for I the LORD thy God *am* a jealous God, visiting the iniquity of the fathers upon the children unto the third and fourth generation of them that hate me; And shewing mercy unto thousands of them that love me, and keep my commandments.

#3 *Thou shalt not take the name of the LORD thy God in vain;* for the LORD will not hold him guiltless that taketh his name in vain.

The Lord's Prayer (Matthew 6:5-15)

Jesus said:

“And when thou prayest, thou shalt not be as the hypocrites *are*: for they love to pray standing in the synagogues and in the corners of the streets, that they may be seen of men. Verily I say unto you, They have their reward. But thou, when thou prayest, enter into thy closet, and when thou hast shut thy door, pray to thy Father which is in secret; and thy Father which seeth in secret shall reward thee openly. But when ye pray, use not vain repetitions, as the heathen *do*: for they think that they shall be heard for their much speaking. Be not ye therefore like unto them: for your Father knoweth what things ye have need of, before ye ask him. After this manner therefore pray ye:

Our Father which art in heaven, Hallowed be thy name.

Thy kingdom come. Thy will be done in earth, as *it is* in heaven.

Give us this day our daily bread.

And forgive us our debts, as we forgive our debtors.

And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil:

For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, for ever. Amen.”
